

Today is Thumbnail Thursday. We are going to create some sketches of a famous structure.

This week we have talked a lot about famous, functional buildings; old and new. Architecture can also be structures that we don't live or work inside of. There are famous landmarks all over that we can visit. Let's take a look at a few to choose from today.



Here is one many have heard of but know very little about, other than it leans. Do you recognize it? This is the Tower of Pisa (Italy). Little is known about the original Architect because this structure took 199 years to complete! They started it 1173 and did not finish until 1372.





The tower is 7 stories and served as a bell tower. The bell is no longer inside as it was removed to relieve some weight from the leaning building. The tower is made of Marble and stone.





The Eiffel Tower, Paris France.


This tower had 3 Architects/Engineers. The Main Mastermind was Gustave Eiffel. It took two years to complete and was finished in 1889. It was the tallest tower in the world until 1930.

The Eiffel tower was built as an artistic center piece for the World Fair. This sketch to the right is the first sketch from its engineers. It shows the height comparison to the Statue of Liberty and Notre Dame cathedral.






Here is a view from the top! If you ever visit and climb to the top, it feels like your view is endless.






The Burj Kalifa in Dubai. Currently, this is the tallest building in the world. It looks like something from a Science Fiction movie next to the other buildings around it. It took 5 years to build and was completed in 2009. There are multiple uses for this building, some just artistic and structural and some residential and hotel.
