One of the things that helps with criticism is thinking and seeing like an artist.

Answer these 4 questions about what you saw on Reading the Alphabet From Space: 3. What letter was located farthest from you on the globe? Give location and sketch or describe the Google Earth image.

4. What letter was located closest to you on the globe? Give location and sketch or describe the Google Earth image.

Scavenger hunt assignment:

Look around your house and/or go walk through your neighborhood. Take a photo or sketch letters you can see in everyday objects.

Be sure to make a note of where you found the letter and if it's a part of something else. I sometimes challenge myself when I travel to find letters then make them into photo books for a souvenir. Here are some examples from my alphabet hunts.
