- Learning Target: How do artists judge a work of art?

The last step of criticism, judgment, uses all the parts to give reasons for your evaluation on the work.

This IS your opinion of how successful the work is or whether you like it or not.

These are some basic questions to help when doing your judgment:

Judgment: Is it a good artwork? Do you like the artwork? Why or why not?

What criteria do you think are most appropriate for judging the artwork?

Are you judging the artwork based on its formal elements (use of the elements and principles of design)?

Are you judging the work based on its success at imitating the real world?

Are you judging the work based on its emotional content?

Some additional questions you can use:

*Do you like/dislike the work? Why?

*Is the work good/successful? Why?

*Would you have this in your house? Why?

*If you were a gallery owner or museum curator would you have the work there? Why?

The WHY is the most important part of judgment. Be sure to explain your reasoning.

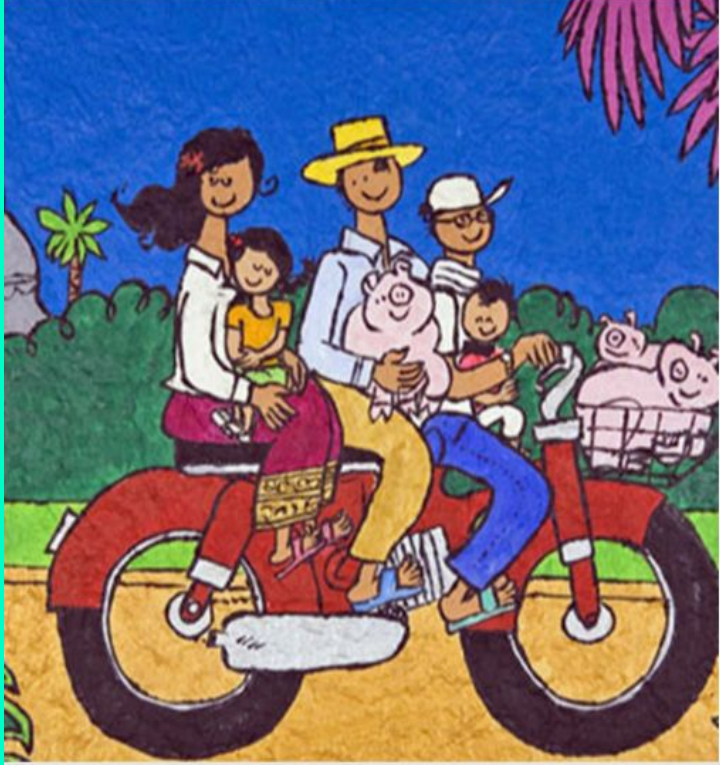

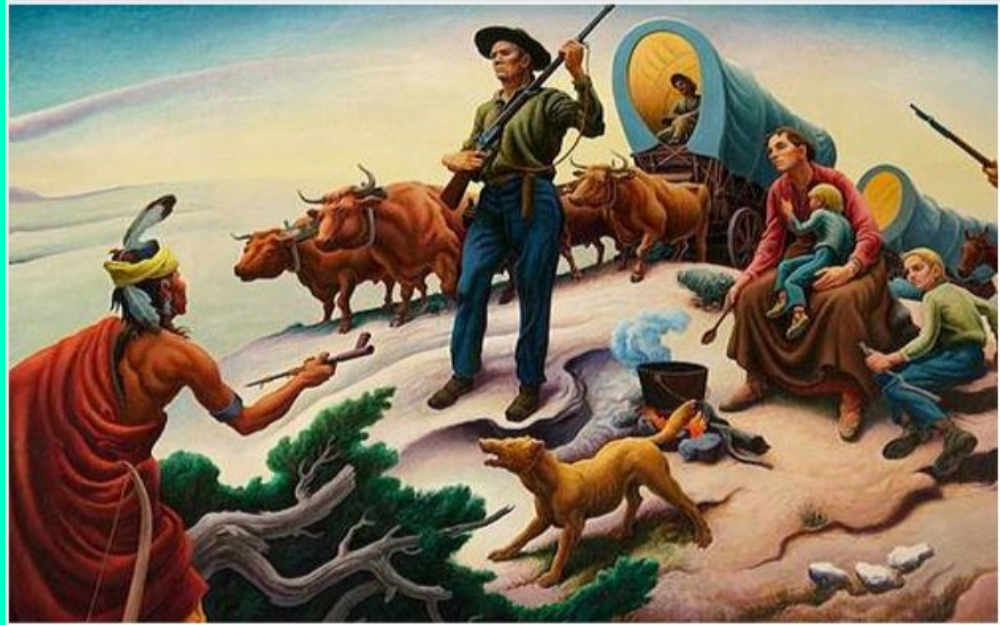


Write your judgment on a new piece of paper if there isn't room on the paper you've been using.
