Today we'll will take some time working on observation skills. We're going to test our artist eyes to see how many faces we can find around the house or neighborhood.

Note: If the weather isn't great today you can wait to search for faces outside when it's better weather.

See how many faces you can find.

Remember you're looking for something that would represent parts of a face - human, alien, monster, or animal.

Objects may have some or all of these:

*eye(s) *nose/beak *mouth *neck
*hair/hat *ear(s)

See how many faces you can find.
Can you photograph or sketch at least 10
faces from your environment?
