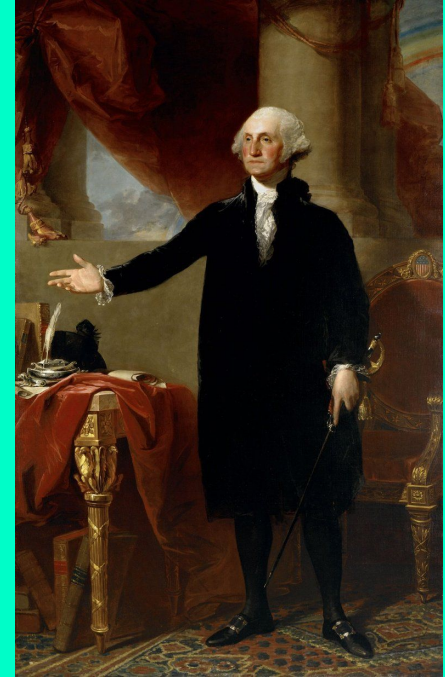

Clothing, towels, sheets, tablecloths - any fabric can be used but you want to consider which colors you need.

Notice the artist in the video really focused on the shapes she needed the fabric to be to make the parts of the face.

You may choose any person you want for your portrait - it does not have to be a self portrait.
