You can use any cables, wires, plugs, or cords that will not disrupt any of the rest of your family's activities.

Notice the artist in the video really focused on the lines and shapes he needed the cords to be to make the parts of the face. See if you can build your own literal wire portrait.

You can choose to add fabric as the artist in the video does, but it's not required

You may choose any person you want for your portrait - it does not have to be a self portrait.
