Are structures built with a style of art?

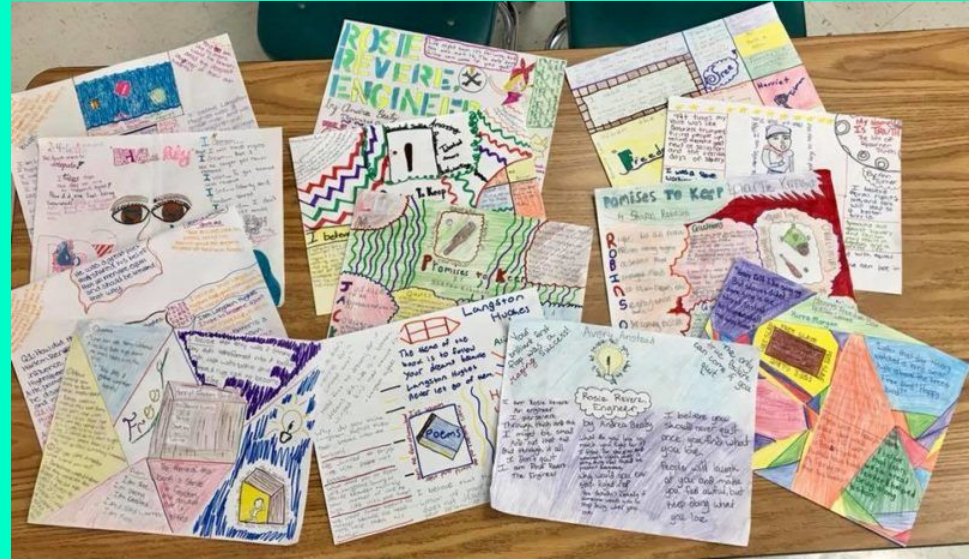
How do the structures around us impact our lives?

Unusual Architecture



In 1892- the WORLD'S ONLY CORN PALACE was established on the city's Main Street. The city's first Corn Palace was built as a way to prove to the world that South Dakota had a healthy agricultural climate. During its over 100 years of existence, it has become known worldwide and now attracts more than half a million visitors annually.
