Repetition is key to memorization and yes at times the key for you getting your way.

While at times effective, it's more likely to get you in trouble after asking multiple times. See the research <u>here</u>.



- 1) Review within 24 hours. Look at script and then look away.
- 2) Trying to recall script in a different setting.(walk)
- 3) Pop Quiz: Randomly test yourself on your script. Multiple ways, multiple times a day.
  Speed Glancing!
- 4) Review in detail! Go word by word to ensure nothing was missed.


1) Mark your <u>new</u> script. (Line count. If you are unsure on how to do this,
