Delivery: Voice



Clarity: enunciation; crispness with which we say the syllables in a word

Problem: slurring sounds together

• Audience has to guess

Solution: practice consciously and ask for feedback

Pitch: highs and lows of your voice

Problem: narrow vocal range (monotone)

Boring

Solution: Vary your pitch

 Stress/emphasize important words

Rate or Pace: speed at which we speak

Problem: Speaking too quickly

- Doesn't give audience time to understand
- Makes meaning unclear
- Can run out of breath

Solution: Slow down

- Take deeper breaths
- Plan pausing
- Emphasize important words
- Vary your rate

Volume: loudness or softness of your voice

Problem: too soft

- Can't hear what you're saying
- Sounds unconfident

Solution: project to the back of the room

- Take deep breaths
- Open your mouth; drop your lower jaw

Pronunciation: saying the sounds of a word properly

Problem: mispronouncing a word

- you appear unprepared
- you appear "not smart" (even if that's not true)

Solution: look it up; don't assume

google it "word pronunciation"
