Delivery: Body Language and Platform Movement



Gestures should be:


- Above your waist
- Below your shoulders

Common Mistakes

- Leaning
- Standing with one leg bent
- Slouching
- Looking at things instead of people
- Fidgeting with hands (clothes, Hair, etc.)
- Swaying

Platform Movement

- Walking or stepping in a purposeful manner from one spot to another while speaking
- Move when going from one section of a speech to another
- Lead with the leg nearest your destination
