1. Looking at the bottom of the Pathway picture on the ISD website you will see a section titled "IRC"



JMOTC is not an extension of the reconstruent mechanism for the uniformed services, students in JMOTC benefit from developing skills applicable to future current including communication, tearsbuilding, phrotosis fraces, self-confidence and other leadership skills. This course sequence can be taken simultaneously with other sourcework. Based upon workforce development data and college mitrature requirements, it is strongly recommended that students participating in these pathways take a minimum of two courses as foreign language. Courses with a bold outline indicate dual cross requirements.

IRC stands for "Industry Recognized Credentials" and with all the courses that you've taken in the chosen pathway, that makes you ready to work and able to get certified more quickly. This also results in higher base pay.
