Learning Targets: Connecting, Creating, Performing, Responding



Warm-up

Music is all around us in many forms. This week we've reviewed rhythms through creating and performing and we've connected and responded to music that makes us and those we know happy.

Essential Question:

Have a dance off with someone in your house. Have three different tempo songs to compete to: (slow, medium, fast) Who won?	Go for a walk with someone. Tell each other and keep track of each sound you hear: (Birds, baby laughing, music in a garage, dog bark, airplane, siren, kids laughing, etc). How many sounds did you hear?
