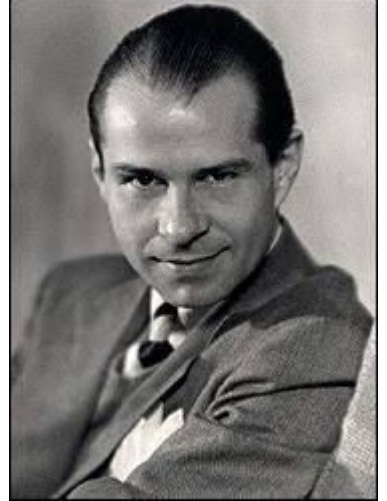

Now let's look at some history:

Frederick Fennell established the Eastman Wind Ensemble in 1952. Doesn't he look cool?



He developed the modern concept of the concert band, similar to what we have today.



Lesson

Fennell also hired composers to write new music for band. Much of that new music became very important for band musicians.

In the 1950s Fennell and the Eastman Wind Ensemble started recording. These recordings were great and helped other musicians learn how to “do band”!

Activity

Listen to the Eastman Wind Ensemble performing “Lincolnshire Posey” by Percy Grainger.
