Early life of Mozart

- Mozart's full name is Johannes Chrysostomus Wolfgangus Theophilus Mozart. (And you thought having a middle name was bad....)
- Mozart was a child prodigy meaning he was performing music at a high level at a young age.
- By the age of 3 he was playing the harpsichord and by the age 5 he was composing/writing his own music!
- Can you imagine writing songs when you were 5 years old??







The Miracle Born in Salzburg

- Mozart's father took both Mozart and his sister to travel across Europe to play for wealthy families and royalty.
- This is how his family earned money. Mozart's father would tell people his son was "The Miracle born in Salzburg!" Everyone wanted to hear what the young Mozart could do!
- They travelled around Europe in a horse drawn carriage so the trips were long and demanding.
 Mozart would often become seriously ill which limited the amount of performances they could have.





Mozart's teenage years

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- Mozart began working for prominent (important) families for money. These were called commissions. He was commissioned to write/perform music for these families. This gave him an opportunity to spend more time studying/writing music.
- It is said that Mozart would come up with full pieces of music in mind and then write the music down on paper with NO EDITS.
 Meaning, he didn't need to correct any mistakes when writing his music down!
- Imagine writing a paper for English having every word already written in your head, writing it down and then not having to spell/grammar check!



Mozart's later years

- Mozart married Constanze Weber and they had two children.
- Mozart became the "Chamber Composer" to Emperor Joseph II for his final job. He only had to write music for the Emperor's dances so he had a lot of time to write operas and other forms of music.
- Mozart wasn't the best with his money and often struggled to pay for the life he wanted to live.
- Mozart became sick at the age of 35 and passed away. Experts believe this happened in part to the many illnesses of his youth.






Why is this Important?
