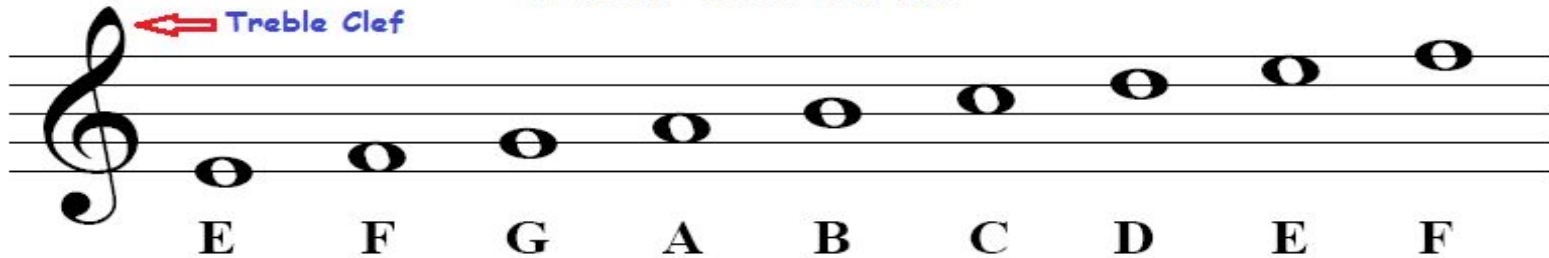

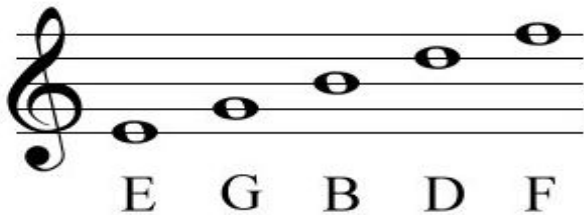

# Identifying Notes on the Treble Clef

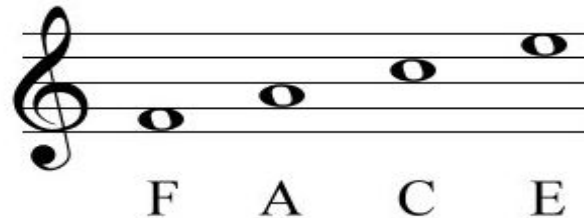
## Treble Clef Notes

## How to Remember

If you have trouble remembering the note names for the lines and spaces, you can use the following acronyms:

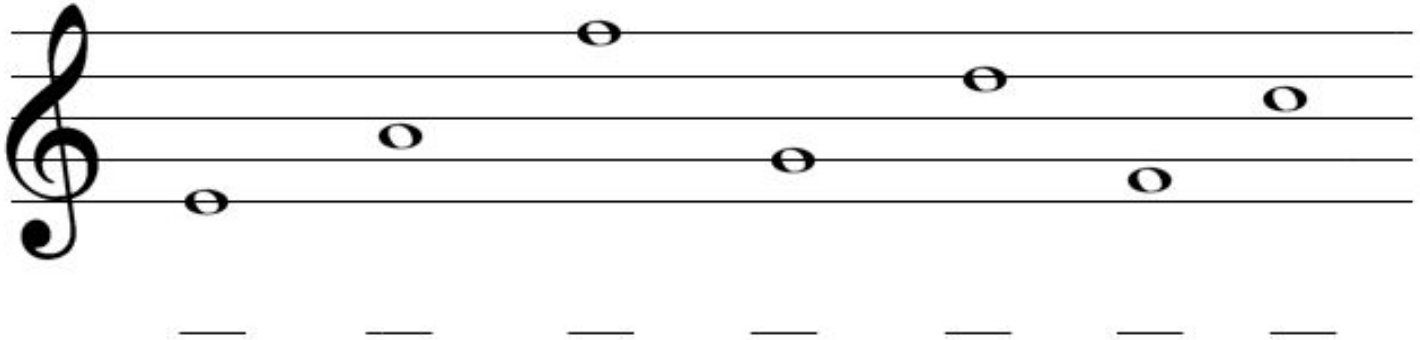
Lines: **E**very **G**ood **B**oy **D**oes **F**ine

Spaces: spells the word **F A C E**

The goal is to be able to recognize these notes quickly. Repetition is key!
