Objective/Learning Target:

Students will be able to create music that fits a scene or mood.



Music in Film

Create Your Own Film Score

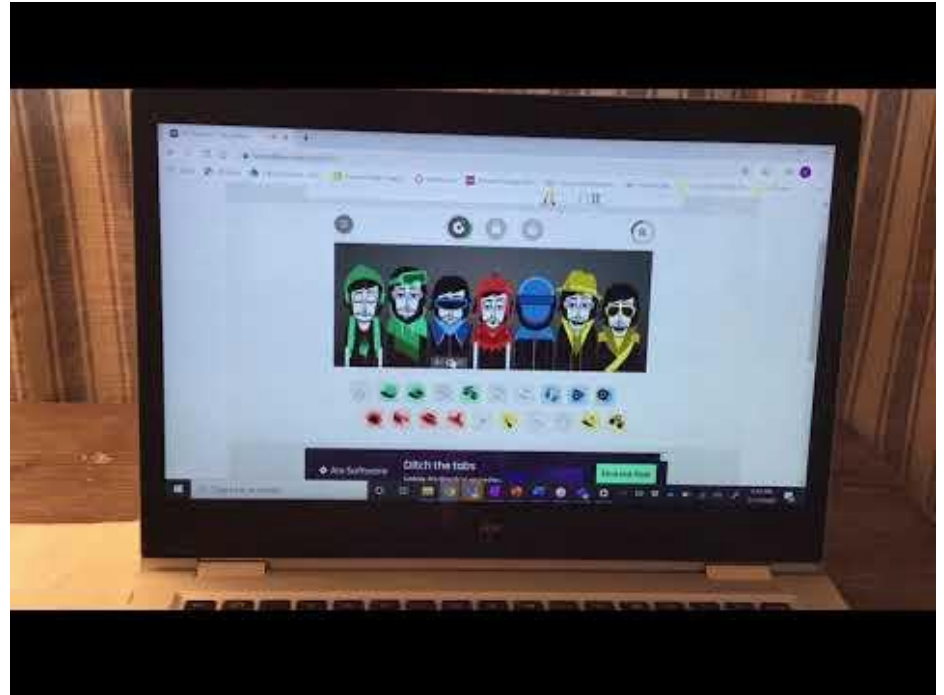
Today you are going to create your own film score based off of a given scene. In order to do that you're going to use a program called [Incredibox](#). It's a great free website that allows you to experiment with different sounds to create your own music. You can even record and share what you make.



Incredibox Tutorial

One thing to keep in mind, in the tutorial it says 3 of the options are mobile only but that is no longer the case so you can use the 3 bottom options as well.





Choose Your Scene

Now that you're familiar with Incredibox, you're going to pick a scene from the following slides and try to create a soundtrack that fits that scene. Experimentation is what this is all about so take your time and have fun with it!

Scene 1: Haunted Museum: Two cautious but curious teens are creeping through a museum at night. The museum is dark and quiet when the teens suddenly hear a sound from behind the Mummies of Ancient Egypt display.

Scene 2: Day In The Park: A frisky, young beagle takes a trip to a new place his human has never taken her before. It's a park designed specifically for dogs! She runs as fast as she can, runs through an obstacle course, rolls on her back in the grass and plays catch with her human in the sunshine.



Choose Your Scene (Cont'd)

Scene 3: Dance Club: It's Saturday night and Jaxon has just made it to the dance club to hang with his friends. You can hear the bass thumping as he opens the door to the club. It is crowded and loud and everyone's dancing.

Scene 4: Basketball: She stands on the 3 point line, eyes on the net. She grips the basketball a little harder as she thinks about tomorrow. Tomorrow she plays for a room full of college scouts and this is her last practice. She takes a deep breath and runs into the game.
