

Guitar Tablature


Tablature is the notation specifically used to guitars. The structure is completely different from standard notation and serves as the "blueprint" for how to play a song.

Intro to Guitar Tabs



How to Remember:

Previously, we discussed the acronym "Eddie Ate Dynamite, Good Bye Eddie" to remember the letter names for each guitar string. Tablature uses 6 lines instead of 5, a line for each string. As noted in the video, the string with the lowest pitch is the lowest line and vice versa.
