




# What Are Triads?





## Major and Minor triads





Major triads contain the root note, a major 3rd (<u>4 half steps up</u>), and a 5th. Ex: C-E-G

Minor triads contain the root note, a minor 3rd (<u>3 half</u> <u>steps up)</u>, and a 5th. Ex: C-Eb-G






Major triads contain the root note, a major 3rd (4 half steps up), and a 5th.


Ex: C-E-G

Minor triads contain the root note, a minor 3rd (<u>3 half</u> steps up), and a 5th.








