Objective/Learning Target: Lesson 6, Part 1

Students will learn the difference between inherited and non-inherited traits.

Warm-Ups:

Lesson Introduction/Background Information:

Inherited vs. Non-Inherited Traits

Traits are physical characteristics that can be displayed by humans, animals and some plants. Inherited traits can be both physical and behavioral. These inherited traits are passed down genetically from one generation to the next.

Non-inherited traits are learned traits.
