6th Grade Intro to Technology Lesson: April 30 (Part 4 of 4)

Objective/Learning Target:

Students will write and format a family newsletter to digitally share family news and stories with relatives and friends.

Warm-Ups:

First, now find a newspaper or news website to look at.

Rather than worrying about the content, instead look at some of the text features. What do you notice that makes the articles more interesting to read in terms of formatting? Bigger fonts for titles? Bolding, italics, underlining? Graphics?

Lesson Introduction/Background Information:

We are all separated from some of the people in our lives right now. Some of us have a house full of family that we are living with, and some of us have very few people at home. All over the world, families and friends have been staying connected with each other in new ways. This week, we are going to help keep your family and friends updated on what's going on in your home by creating a family newsletter in Google Docs.

Practice:

Today we are going to format our newsletter to make it look more like a newsletter/more visually interesting. Take the following steps:

- Highlight your title and change it to a larger font size and a different type of interesting font (that you can still read).
- 2. Also highlight your date (your subheading) and make that font larger and look different, maybe by italicizing it.

Shelton Shenanigans


