Tasks that the professional therapy dogs are trained to do include retrieving, "go to" or "go find," etc. A pet therapy dog is partnered with a handler creating a bond and a working team. By placing a professional therapy dog with building principal, Mrs. Hawley, a team will be developed and the outcomes will be measured based on successes within the scope of the office disciplinary referrals and out-of-classroom time.

Q: Does Milli come to school everyday?

She also enjoys going to restaurants and stores to practice her good behavior and skills. Milli is a certified assistance dog, she is able to go to all these places and meet lots of new people!
