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ACCELERATED READER

Accelerated Reader (AR) is a computerized reading management program that is being used nationwide to motivate children to read. This program will be implemented in addition to our traditional reading/language curriculum. Students will be assessed early in the school year using the STAR, Standardized Test for Assessment of Reading. This report will give valuable information, which will enable the teacher to provide individualized support for each student. Teachers will be building into their class schedules increased reading practice time. Students will read books at their appropriate reading level and take computerized tests demonstrating comprehension skills. The students will accumulate points to be used in an incentive program.

BULLY POLICY

We, at Santa Fe Trail Elementary, believe every child deserves a safe learning environment. Because we desire for every child to learn and be successful, as a staff, we are committed to insure that students are not disruptive or hurtful to the learning of all children. We are committed to making Santa Fe Trail a "bully free school" and have included examples of bullying behavior that will not be tolerated. We have also included specific consequences that we will follow through with in order to prevent bullying and protect the safety and well-being for all our students.

Santa Fe Trail's Bully Free Policy

Bully — A person who repeatedly and intentionally inflicts physical, verbal, non-verbal or emotional abuse on another person.

3rd Bullying Offense


- Formal apology, 5 hours of school community service

SANTA FE TRAIL DAILY SCHEDULE

The instructional school day begins at 8:15 a.m. and ends at 3:09 p.m. Time on task is essential to student success. Therefore, **keeping interruptions to a minimum protects instructional time.**

School assemblies and other extra programs are planned carefully so that disruptions to the regular academic school day do not occur too often. We encourage you to help by being sure your child arrives in his/her classroom by 8:15 a.m. and remains in class until 3:09 p.m. Uninterrupted time on task results in better learning for our students.

All doors at Santa Fe Trail are locked to insure student safety. This is a safety measure that is followed for the entire Independence School District. The earliest students may enter the building each morning is 7:55 a.m., providing they are eating breakfast. If students do not eat breakfast, the earliest they may enter the building is 8:10 a.m.

Please note, regardless of the weather conditions, students will not be able to enter the building prior to this time due to supervision purposes. On inclement weather, days please remember that students will not be able to enter the building until the times indicated.

INFORMATION FOR CAR RIDERS/DRIVERS

Students picked up from school should be picked up within 10 minutes of dismissal.

Parent's picking students up in cars need to follow these guidelines. **BUSES ONLY ENTER THE FRONT CIRCLE DRIVE.** No cars can be waiting in the circle drive because the buses need the space for turning. If it is necessary to transport your student by car, <u>please do not drop your student(s) off in</u> <u>the front circle drive/bus lane</u>. This lane is for buses only. Staff members and the building principal supervise arrival and dismissal of buses. If cars mistakenly unload in the bus zones, the building principal will follow up with a verbal reminder as a courtesy for protection of student safety.

We ask all students that are brought to and from school by car to use the north exit door. Students will be directed to walkways by teacher/s on duty. After picking up, or dropping off students, cars will proceed in line to exit. FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL, PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR CAR AND STAY IN LINE. School staff will be focusing on observing the safety of all students and will not allow students to cross parked cars.

Please exercise patience, as we want all our children to be safe as they enter or leave school.

Outside your child's classroom or in the hallway is not an acceptable meeting place, due to maximum hallway use by students at dismissal time.

Dismissal Changes – Routine procedures at dismissal for students provides consistency, enhances your child's learning and avoids confusion for your child. If it is absolutely necessary that your child's dismissal routine be changed, please contact the office by 2: 30 p.m.

SIGNING STUDENTS IN/OUT/ATTENDANCE

If a student is arriving tardy, or must leave early, parents are required to sign students in or out in the school office. Parents will be required to wait in the office while students are being called from the classroom. A student must be in attendance for the school day to participate in an extra-curricular activity at night.

INFORMATION FOR WALKERS

Students who walk to and from school should go directly to school or home. School rules still apply until the student has arrived. The school maintains authority to discipline students for incidents occurring on the way to and from school. Bullying and harassment are unacceptable. **Students should not arrive at school before 8:10 a.m. unless they eat breakfast for which they may arrive at 7:55 a.m. Students will not be allowed to enter the building prior to this time.**
