Coming Soon: Enrollment 2014-15

Beginning in the next few weeks, Falcons will start the process of choosing classes for the upcoming school year. Much of this process will remain similar to past years at Van Horn, with few notable exceptions.

One of the major changes for enrollment will involve how courses are picked in core areas - English, Social Studies, Science, and Math. In these areas recommendations will be made for each student based on his/her performance on standardized exams, classroom work, and state assessments. Though parents/guardians can still make a final decision by attending parent/teacher conferences in February, this recommendation process will be the primary way students are placed in core classes.

Students will still select elective options geared towards their postsecondary plans. We encourage families to discuss these options carefully. Students need to plan their course of study based on where they hope to be after graduation. Enrollment & Parent/Teacher Conferences February 11th and 12th

Second semester parent/teacher conferences will be held on February 11th from 4-7 PM and on February 12th from 3-7:30 PM. These conferences are held to give parents a chance to meet second semester teachers, check up on their student's performance, and sign off with their student's advisor on 2014-15 enrollment.

There will also be two meetings for parents of graduating seniors. All senior parents need to attend one parent meeting before graduation. The meetings will be held each night of conferences at 5 PM in the Little Theatre.

Are you on track for Graduation?

In order to graduate in four years, students must complete 25 credits in the following subject areas:

- English 4 credits
- Math 3 credits
- Social Studies 3 credits
- Science 3 credits
- Fine Arts 1 credit
- Practical Arts 1 credit
- PE 1 credit
- Health .5 credit
- Career Connections .5 credit
- Personal Finance . 5 credit
- Electives 7.5 credits

MU System Requirements

The following requirements are specific to helping students obtain admission into the University of Missouri system.

- **English:** Four units, one of which may be in speech or debate; two units emphasizing composition or writing skills
- Mathematics: Four units, Algebra 1 or higher
- Science: Three units* (not including general science), one of which must be a lab
- Social Studies: Three units**
- Foreign Language: Two units of the same language
- Fine Arts: One unit

Students are enrolled in seven classes each semester making the total possible credits per semester 3.5. To be on track for graduation in four years, students need to successfully complete seven credits per year their 9th, 10th, and 11th grade school years. There are several options available for students to "get back on track" including Summer School, Night School, and ALS classes. Students are encouraged to schedule an appointment with their school counselor to develop an individualized graduation plan.

For the past several years, students at Van Horn have been a part of an exciting program that brings real-world business experience into the classroom along with providing opportunities to see first hand how successful businesses operate in our larger community.

Youth Entrepreneurs (YE) is a yearlong class that teaches business and entrepreneurial education. YE gives students a chance to create a small business and sell merchandise to their school during lunch, through our Market Days program, potentially earning a profit which the student keeps. YE also exposes students to a variety of local businesses, an etiquette business lunch, and a variety of economics activities outside the classroom with the chance to earn money/scholarships to either help the student through college or to start their own business.
